
## Criminal Justice Careers

#### **Possible Job Duties:**

 Patrol certain areas, respond to calls, make arrests, issue warnings or tickets, testify in court cases, provide first-aid, make traffic stops

#### **Standard Qualifications:**

- Being a U.S. citizen, at least 21 years of age, having no felony convictions, able to meet phsyical and medical qualifications,
- Certain agencies have other specific qualifications and requirements. For example, some agencies require officers to have at least a high school diploma while others requre an associate or bacherlor degree.
